

Joseph D'Aleo was co-founder and the first Director of Meteorology at the cable TV Weather Channel. He has over 48 years experience in professional meteorology. He helped establish the meteorology program at Lyndon State College where he was a college professor of Meteorology and Climatology for 6 years.

He and John Coleman founded The Weather Channel in 1982, was responsible for hiring the initial staff and designing the initial programming.

Mr. D'Aleo left to be Chief Meteorologist at WSI Corporation, where he focused on product development for media and later R&D into multivariate statistical modeling for long range forecasting. He was

Senior Editor and "Dr. Dewpoint" for WSI's popular Intellicast.com web site.

He authored a Resource Guide on El Nino and La Nina for Greenwood Publishing. Mr. D'Aleo has also authored articles and peer reviewed papers and made numerous presentations how understanding sun and ocean cycles have made seasonal climate forecasting skillful and explain changing regimes in climate and associated extremes. Joe was a partner in a hedge fund trading energy and agriculture before joining Joe Bastardi at Weatherbell.

Mr. D'Aleo is a Certified Consultant Meteorologist and was elected a Fellow of the American Meteorological Society (AMS). He has chaired the American Meteorological Society' Committee on Weather Analysis and Forecasting, and has co-chaired national conferences for both the American Meteorological Society and the National Weather Association. Mr. D'Aleo was elected a Councilor for the AMS. He has shared awards from the AMS, NWA for his corporate successes with ABC/GMA, The Weather Channel and WSI.

Joseph D'Aleo is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin BS, MS and an ABD in Atmospheric Chemistry from NYU. He was awarded a PhD (honorary) from VSC for starting one of America's foremost meteorology programs there and then the Weather Channel.
