2020 NH HOUSE SCORECARD

The GST scorecard for the 2019-2020 New Hampshire House was based on thirty roll-call votes taken over the course of the session. Besides taxes, bills were also included on spending, business regulation, voting integrity, electric rates and other issues of interest to taxpayers.

The scorecard lists each representative's score as a percentage of taxpayer-friendly votes, with half-credit given for missed votes. There is also a column for the percentage of the thirty votes the representative participated in. We do not list the half-dozen representatives who did not serve full two-year terms, or the dozen who did not participate in at least fifteen of these votes, including Speaker Shurtleff who by tradition does not vote except to break ties.

Except for the governor's vetoes, the taxpayers didn't fare too well this term. The 233 Democrats had an average score of 19, while the 162 Republicans had an average score of 88. Democrats just beat Republicans in attendance: 87 to 84.
