# DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS AND VETERANS SERVICES

<u>4B.</u> Authorized the confirmation of **Captain Jordan P. Gauvin, Stratham, NH**, for appointment to the rank of Major, in the NH Air National Guard.

# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FINANCE AUTHORITY

Authorized, under the Community Development Block Grant program, to amend a grant agreement with the County of Rockingham, Brentwood, NH (originally approved by G&C on 8/18/21, Item #49), in the amount of \$355,850 by extending the completion date from December 30, 2023 to December 31, 2024, to allow for the completion of the water system improvement project. Effective upon G&C approval. No additional funding is involved in this time extension request. 100% Federal Funds

Authorized to amend an American Rescue Plan Act grant to Iron Wheel, LLC, Danville, NH (originally approved by G&C on 1/18/23, Item #81), by extending the completion date from December 1, 2023 to June 1, 2025, and reducing the grant limitation by \$404,200 from \$506,200 to \$102,000, to perform the one-year operation and maintenance optimization from the time of treatment system install to ensure safe drinking water quality. Effective retroactive to July 1, 2023, upon G&C approval through June 30, 2024, with the expectation the parties will renew annually. **100% Other Funds (Revenue)** Rockingham County contributed \$19,207,690.

<u>#13</u> Authorized to enter into grant agreements with the Grantees as detailed in the letter dated November 7, 2023, in an amount not to exceed \$4,380,591 for Workforce Recruitment and Retention Strategies for Home and Community Based Services. Effective upon G&C approval through March 31, 2025. **100% Federal Funds Aspire Living and Learning** (Stratham) received \$400,010.
