JUNE 26, 2024 EXECUTIVE COUNCIL BREAKFAST MEETING - TREASURY

The June 26, 2024 Executive Council breakfast meeting was held at the State of New Hampshire Treasury offices. The primary focus of the meeting was to discuss the credit rating for the State of New Hampshire, which has been defined as "Stable Outlook" by the three major rating agencies.

Moody's Investor Service issued a rating of Aa1, Fitch Ratings assigned New Hampshire an AA+ and S&P Global Ratings recently upgraded New Hampshire's credit rating from AA to AA+, while also assigning this rating to New Hampshire's \$60 million General Obligation bonds. New Hampshire's current General Obligation debt is \$661.5 million,

Discussion on factors contributing to agency credit ratings: Healthy Economic Indicators, Strong Financial Management, Low Debt Levels and Strong Cash Reserves.

HEALTHY ECONOMIC INDICATORS -

NH's robust economy with low unemployment (2.5% May 2024), the 7th highest per capita personal income in the nation, and steady economic growth.

The Granite State has a diverse, enviable economy with strong sectors in tech, healthcare, education, bioscience sector - provides resilience against economic downturns.

A 5.3% population increase in New Hampshire - which exceeded other New England states - a bonus for labor participation. "The upgrades incorporate our view of New Hampshire's improved economic and demographic growth trends that continue to perform near or above those of the U.S. and regional peers," S&P Ratings Credit Analyst.

STRONG FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT -

"Our view of the state's demonstrated commitment to controlling expenditure growth, preserving revenue stability, and building higher reserve balances across recent economic cycles that we believe position it to sustain financial stability in the current and future biennial budgets" S&P Ratings Credit Analyst.

New Hampshire is a state known for balanced budgets, diverse revenue sources and discipline in setting aside reserves for unforeseen circumstances. For FY'23 - New Hampshire's Rainy Day Fund has increased by more than 1200% to \$295,500,000 since FY'15.

The unrestricted General Fund Reserve grew by approximately 47 % during FY'15 - FY'23.

LOW DEBT LEVELS -

New Hampshire's debt burden for General Obligation, Turnpike and GARVEE (Grant Anticipation Vehicle) bonds - have all decreased.

STRONG CASH RESERVES

Again, NH's Rainy Day Fund, which serves as a safety net and provides liquidity in an economic down cycle or unexpected fiscal challenge, has increased significantly since 2015.

The State's Operating Cash Balance has also increased to \$2.6 million dollars (June 1, 2024)

MEDICAID CARE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM - DENTAL CARE

The State of New Hampshire entered into a \$33,484,749 contract with Delta Dental Plan of NH Inc. on April 1, 2023, to provide dental care to residents enrolled in the state's Medicaid Care Management Program. The first amendment to the contract, included in the June 26, 2024 meeting, increases the price limitation by \$15,960,801, raising it from \$33,484,749 to \$49,445,550, with a completion date of March 31, 2026.

Dental care can be costly, and for residents lacking dental insurance, access to preventive care can be financially challenging. This often results in deferred care, increasing the risk of developing dental disease. Dental care is a critical component of public health, and expanding access to oral health care is good public policy.

In preparation for the June 26, 2024 Executive Council meeting, I reviewed the entire 600+ page contract between Delta Dental Plan of NH Inc. and DentaQuest (the administrator). I also spoke extensively with New Hampshire State Medicaid Director Henry Lipman and leadership/providers at the New Hampshire Dental Society.

INITIAL AREAS OF CONCERN -

ONBOARDING OF PROVIDERS - MEMBER UTILIZATION

The current number of licensed NH Dentists participating in NH's Medicaid dental plan - 161

Current number of NH Oral Surgeons participating in the dental plan - 20

Approximately 88,000 Medicaid eligible NH residents enrolled for dental coverage

As of June 26, 2024 - approximately 15,000 residents have received care.

Providers I spoke with expressed frustration with the delays associated with the onboarding process and subsequent issues with signing into accounts and reimbursement rates involving lab services.

CALIBRATE CAPITATION - MEDICAL LOSS RATIO

The contract amendment included a 40% downward adjustment for capitation payments (below)

The need to "calibrate the capitation rates to reflect updated actuarial source data and emerging experiences demonstrating that the potential pent-up demand originally forecasted has not yet materialized due in part to the extent of network thus far in place". The original contract provided for a Medical Loss Ratio of 85% with the vendor retaining 15% profit. The Medical Loss Ratio was below 85% which resulted in the vendor returning funds to the State of New Hampshire and Federal Government. The State of New Hampshire will receive a return of \$5 million to \$6 million dollars for Medical Loss Ratio falling below 85%. The State of New Hampshire's contribution to the dental medicaid program was funded through a settlement with Centene. I asked if these funds could be utilized for increasing the reimbursement rates for dental fee-for-service. Not at this time.

COSTS AND CARE

Dental providers receive a capitation rate per member per month. The amended contract reduces the amount per patient per month. Please note:

The cap on general care coordination services may not be sufficient.

The dental provider serving as President of the NH Dental Society shared the following concerns:

The \$1500 Care Coordination cap is a challenge. Many of his patients have deferred care and delaying - spreading out care - could impact overall health

The reimbursement rates for dental work requiring lab services - crowns, bridges - will likely result in the providers losing money.

An External Quality Review (EQR) will be conducted to assess the performance of Delta Dental and Dentaquest. The results of the EQR will provide an overall performance of the program and will measure critical patient care needs including - timeliness of care, geographic access standards, non-emergency transportation services, member services.

This request for Governor and Council approval is to allow the Department and the PDA attorneys to execute all FAA grants issued in FFY 2024 and FY2025. This will include any FAA AIP, BIL CDS and emergency funding that the FAA grants in addition to what is outlined in the attached available funding notification documentation.

The funding listed above is a portion of the amount that the PDA expects to receive from the FAA through both the AIP, BIL and CDS. The actual airport grant awards will be submitted to the Governor and Council for approval with the actual funding account string and exact amount needed to complete each project. To date, the total federal amount requested from the FAA is \$9,250,577. The FAA may grant less funding or additional funds depending upon project priority and available funds. Additional grant applications to the FAA may be submitted by the Pease Development Authority as funding opportunities arise. All AIP funds received from the FAA are 90% federal share and are typically matched with 5% State funding and a 5% local sponsor share. BIL funds may be funded at 100%, 95% or 90% federal funds depending on the type of project. The non-federal share to match the BIL funds, if any, would normally be split evenly between the State and local sponsor.
